Accessing our service

At Information Advice and Support (IAS) we offer free information, advice and support on all sorts of matters relating to special educational needs and disability (SEND), including education, health and social care. All our advisers are independently trained to provide parents and carers with accurate information about the law relating to SEND.

A child or young person does NOT need a formal diagnosis to access our support, in fact this is very often the case. By providing the right advice and support, we will help parents and carers to feel confident to contribute fully to assessments, planning and decisions affecting your child or young person's education, health and social care.

We can provide support for children and young people 25 years old and under, giving information and practical help to make sure their views are heard and included.

We aim to provide you with help that is right for you. This can include:

- Listening to your views and concerns
- Giving young people a voice
- Helping you feel more confident to express your views
- Explaining the law and your options, rights and responsibilities
- Helping with forms, letters and reports
- Helping prepare for meetings and/or attending meetings with you
- Answering your questions about Special Educational Needs and Educational Health Care (EHC) Plans
- Supporting you through Needs Assessment or Review
- Supporting you to resolve disagreements
- Signposting you to other networks or services that may be of help

Our service is accessible to everyone who needs it and lives in the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead and we will respond as flexibly as we can to cater to individual circumstances and needs.

How we work

Our service is free, confidential and impartial. Any personal information you give us will only be shared with your consent*.

The IAS Service for Windsor and Maidenhead is a statutory service provided at "arm's length". This means that we work separately from council and other services that make decisions about provision for children and young people. This ensures the information, advice and support given is impartial. We can support you to share your views and make sure your voice is heard.

Who can we help

- Children and young people, parents or carers of a child or young person with a disability and/or special educational needs.
- parents or carers who are worried that their child or young person has, or may have, special educational needs.
- young people aged up to 25 who have a disability and/or special educational needs.

Our service is for people who live in the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead (RBWM). We can help whether your education is within the borough or elsewhere.

How we can help

We offer an individual service to provide the information and advice that is right for you. This may include:

- listening to your views and concerns
 explaining your options, rights and responsibilities
- help in preparing for meetings and/or attending meetings with you
- advice regarding SEN Support
- supporting you through an Educational
- Health and Care (EHC) Needs Assessment
 answering questions about EHC Plans and Annual Review
- guidance around school avoidance, suspensions and exclusions
- support to resolve disagreements including through mediation and appeals to the SEND Tribunal
