14 RBWM schools are excited to be taking part in PINS, a national project funded by NHS England, in partnership with the Department for Education, Department of Health and Social Care, and the National Network of Parent Carer Forums (of which SEND Voices RBWM is a member).

The partnerships bit refers to bringing together the Integrated Care Board (NHS Frimley and partner organisations), the local authorities (Bracknell and RBWM), the local parent carer forums and, crucially, our school communities – children and young people, their families, and school staff – to work together to understand and improve support for neurodivergent children.

A key part of the project is the voice and input from parent/carers. Our forum will be creating parent carer groups and a survey for parents and carers (not just of children with SEND – special educational needs and/or disabilities). This will help to identify what is currently working or not working in our schools. Training and support will then be provided, and there will also be a focus on understanding children’s experiences in school to help improve the classroom environment – something that hopefully will be beneficial to all children and young people.
