Aims & Bubbles

- We need to work cooperatively and transparently with parents to keep everyone as safe as possible
- We have planned as thoroughly as we can at this point following the guidance
- We are expecting to welcome back the vast majority of our students,
- We will keep classes as separate from each other as much as possible, but it will be clusters who are the 'bubbles'
- Any member of the school community with symptoms should be tested – some students won't cooperate however

Communication and Results

- We won't close bubbles for possible cases, but will provide all the information to parents about class, cluster, transport route, symptoms and test likelihood
- All test results will be shared, if we get a positive the whole class and peers from transport <u>must</u> isolate for 14 days and we'll risk assess further with PHE about the cluster
- If a student has to isolate for 14 days due to a positive result from a contact, the rest of the family <u>do not</u> need to do so as well unless the child develops symptoms
- Parents whose child is in the same class, bubble, transport route or if they have a vulnerable child who is close in the building <u>may</u> choose to revert back to home learning without penalty

Home Learning

- Parents who choose to revert back to home learning will have support virtually
- Teachers will be concentrating on the class in school and we don't want to double their work load
- We will seek explicit permission for sharing of children's images for lesson streaming via Teams to those in the learning at home at appropriate times
- Physical learning packs may need to be collected to support at home

Safety measures

- Temperature checks before students go to class
- Good practice for washing hands and catching coughs and sneezes will taught and encouraged
- PPE in some circumstance
- Additional cleaning throughout the day, particularly high touch areas

Arrival and Departure

- These are staggered for parents and transport
- > First week back is reduced hours 9.00-14.15
- Then parents arrive 8.50
- Depart 14.40
- Parents to remain in the vehicle
- Call reception if you arrive outside of these times

Wellbeing

- Our key focus until at least Christmas will be ensuring the students feel safe emotionally and physically
- We want to support our parents too so you have confidence that we are doing everything possible
- We're asking all parents to complete the questionnaire as it serves as a commitment to the whole community that you will play your part
