Ringworm

We have a diagnosed case of Ringworm in Browne class (Ladybird cluster).

The main symptom of ringworm is a rash. It may look red, silver or darker than surrounding skin, depending on your skin tone. The rash may be scaly, dry, swollen or itchy and it can appear anywhere on the body, including the scalp and groin.

You should speak to a pharmacist for advice on the best antifungal medicine to use and they will tell you if they think you should see a GP.
