She has fifteen years' experience working with young people and has been counselling students at Manor Green School for six years. Catherine's specialities includes counselling students with anxiety (including anxiety for students with ASD), self-harm and gender dysphoria. Catherine can provide risk assessments and training to staff on how to deal with self-harming incidents



Charmain Hartshorne

Charmain is a qualified Person Centred Counsellor and CBT therapist working with children, young people and families for over 10 years. Her specialisms include: working holistically with families who have complex needs or experienced trauma; attachment styles; the PACE model; attuned interactions; evidence based parenting interventions, including therapeutic parenting. Prior to work at Manor Green School, Charmain previously worked for Local Authority in a Family Support Team as a manager.

An example of a support package offered (non-selective mainstream secondary school)

- A full SEN audit
- Action plan created to target areas of need
- A trained SENCo on site, one day per week
- A trained EHCP manager available for EHCPs (preparation and running annual reviews) one day a week
- Training sessions on SEN areas chosen by the school
- One day of support from an exam concessions officer
- Support from a dyslexia specialist
- Training sessions by a counsellor
- Lesson observations of students with SEN, differentiation and areas to improve
- Support with SEN budgeting and finance
- Support with applications to the school for students with EHCPs
- Ongoing mentorship of the SENCo for one term after initial support ended
